6th International Yoga Day Celebration

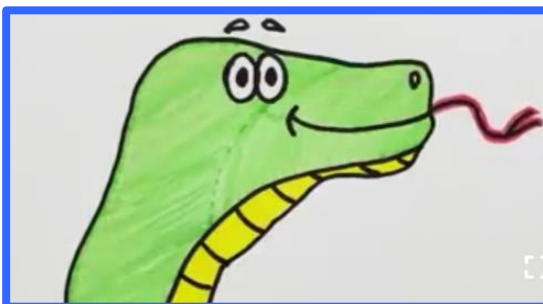

The students were engaged in creative activities to stimulate their imagination, enhance creativity & develop artistic expression in them.

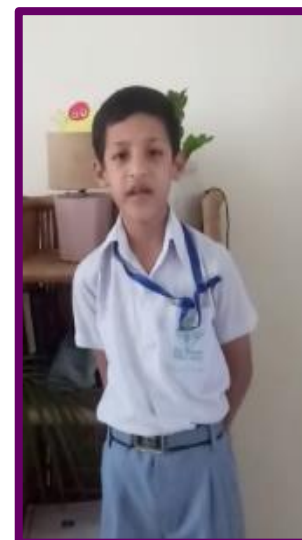
COOKING WITHOUT FIRE

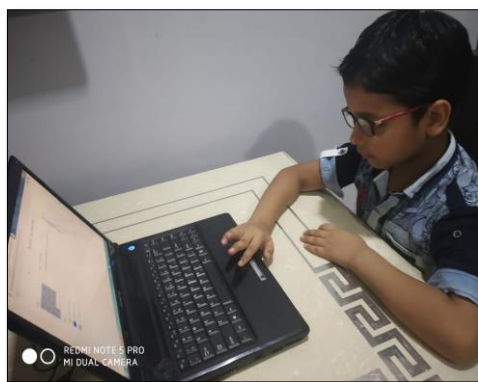
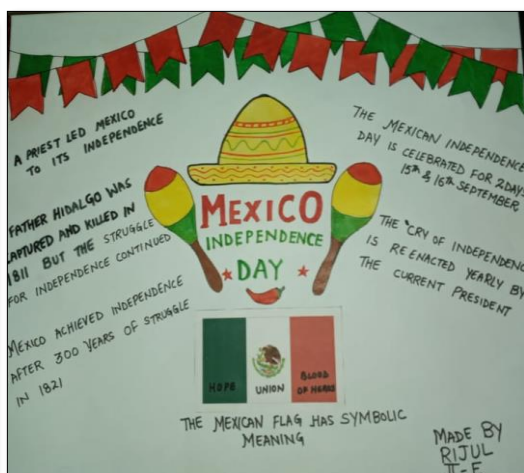
Indoor Circuit Activity

The students drew and coloured the National Flags of the chosen countries and depicted the Independence Day celebration through posters and collages.

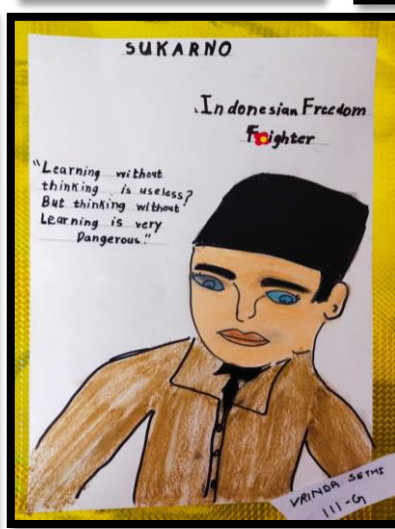
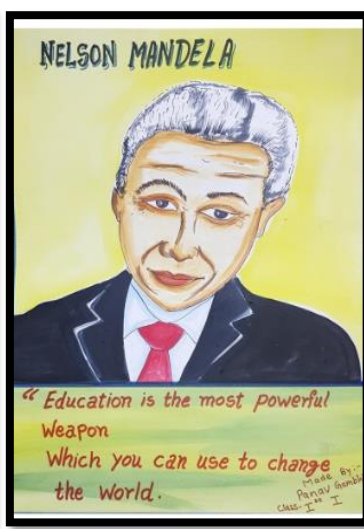
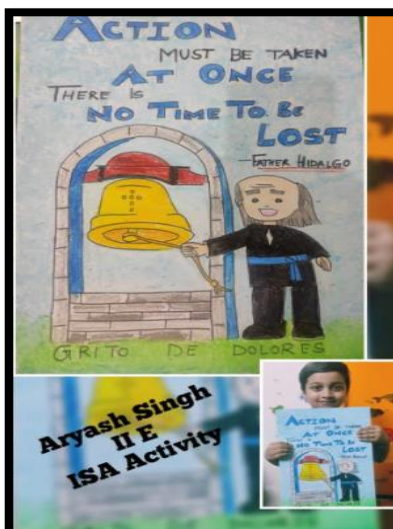


Video Screening and Assignment

The students enacted like leaders/freedom fighters of India, Mexico, Indonesia and South Africa. Their acts included popular quotes and speeches of the chosen leaders.



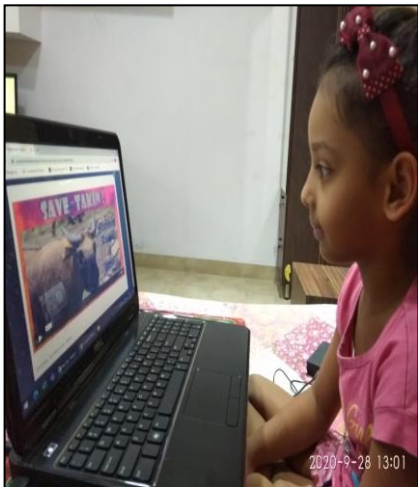
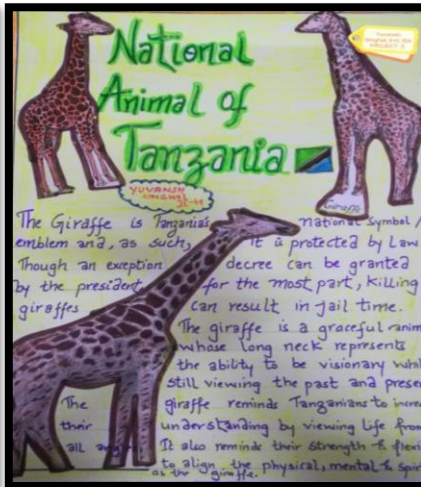
Poster Making Activity

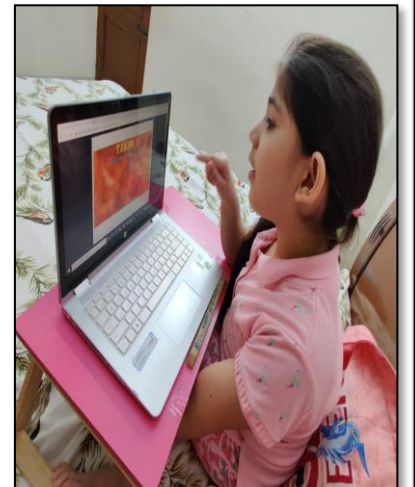
Collage Making

The children made a collage on the National Animals of the chosen countries with focus on their symbolic significance, habitat and food habits.



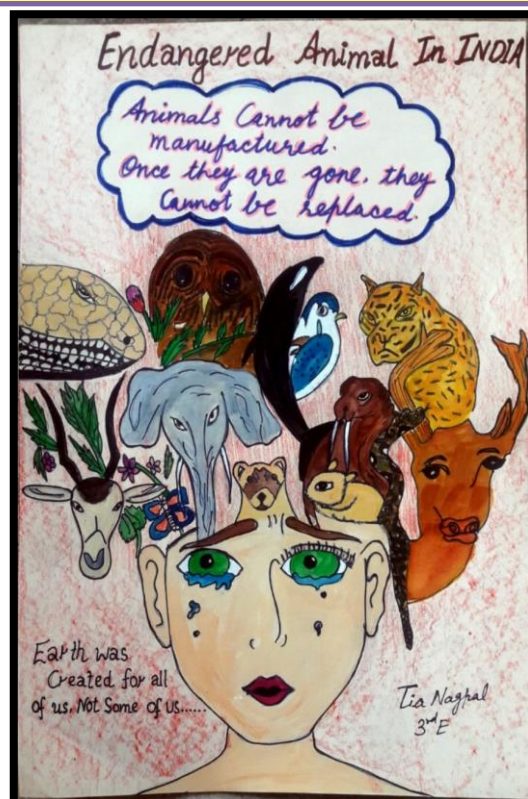
Video Screening and Worksheet

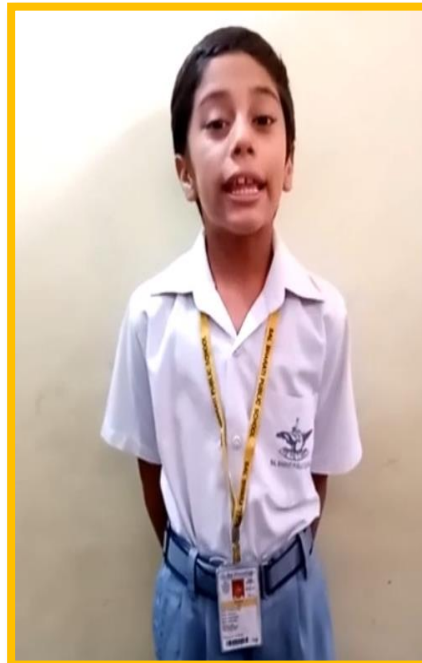
Poster making Competition - Save the Endangered Animals

The students made posters with slogans on the theme with special focus on the national animals of the chosen countries, highlighting the causes behind the threat to their extinction and the need to save them.

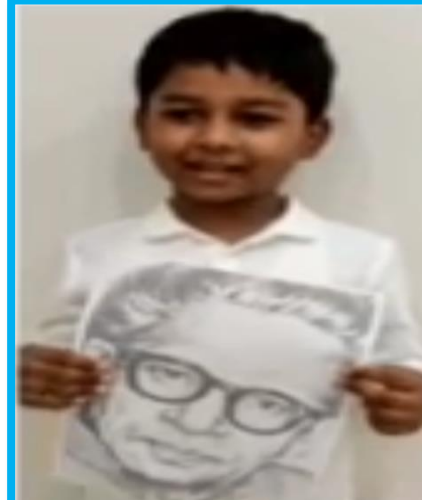

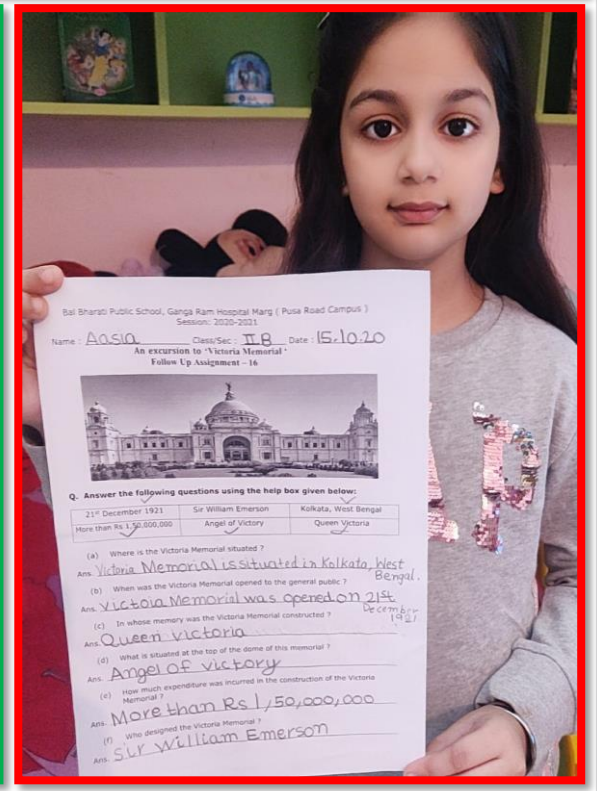
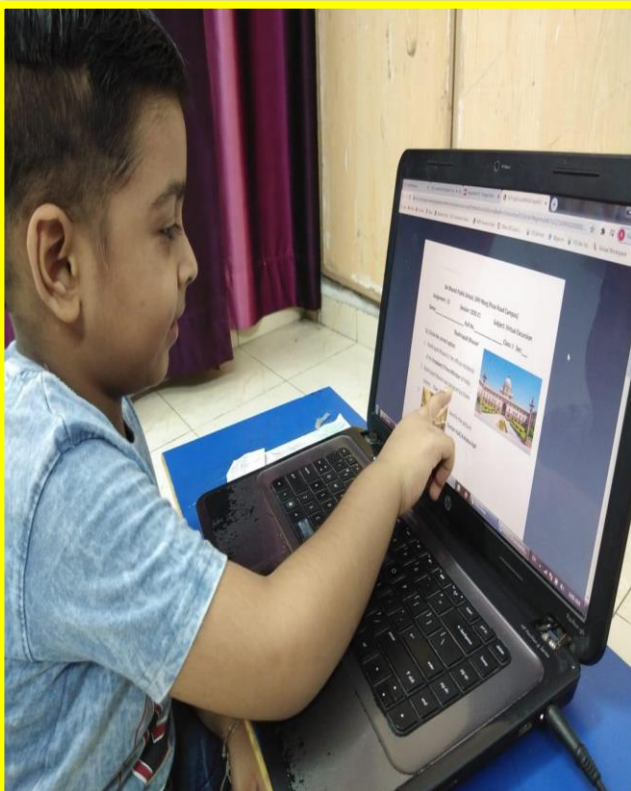
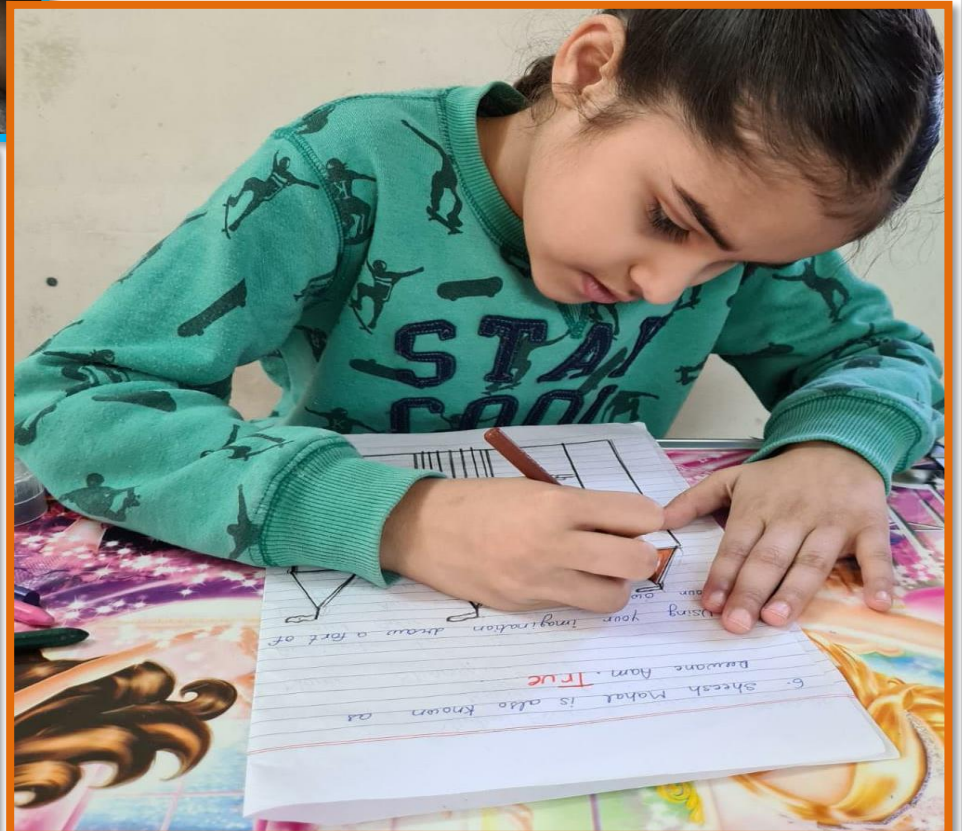
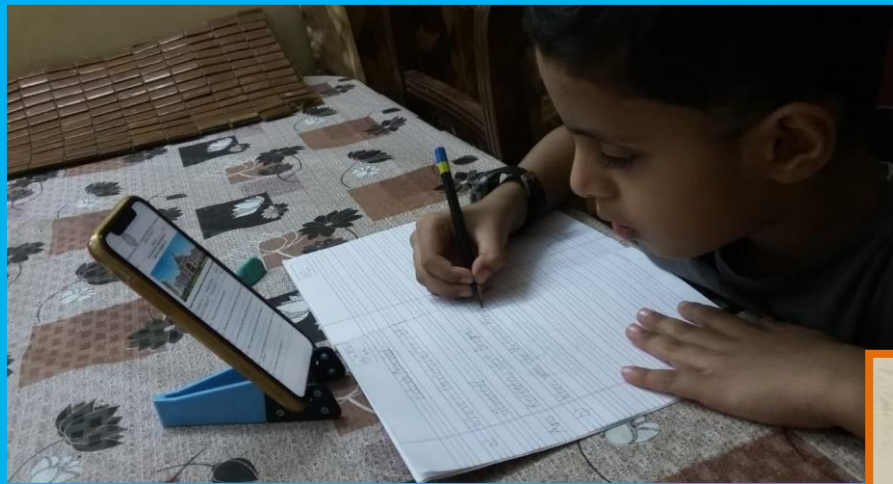
74th Independence Day

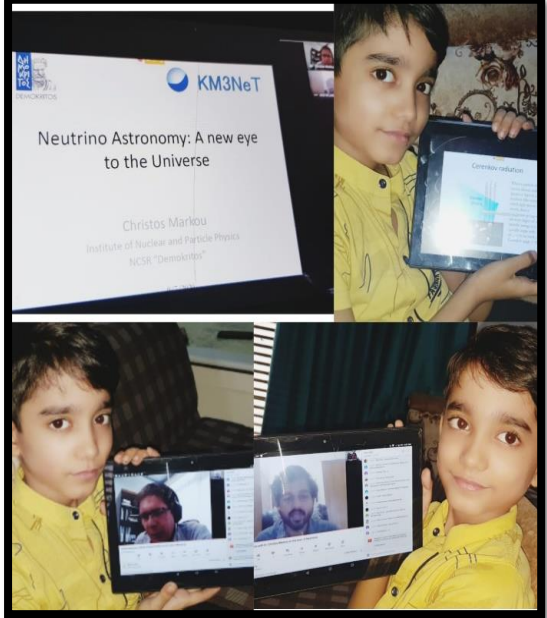
'DOORSTEP ASTRONOMY'

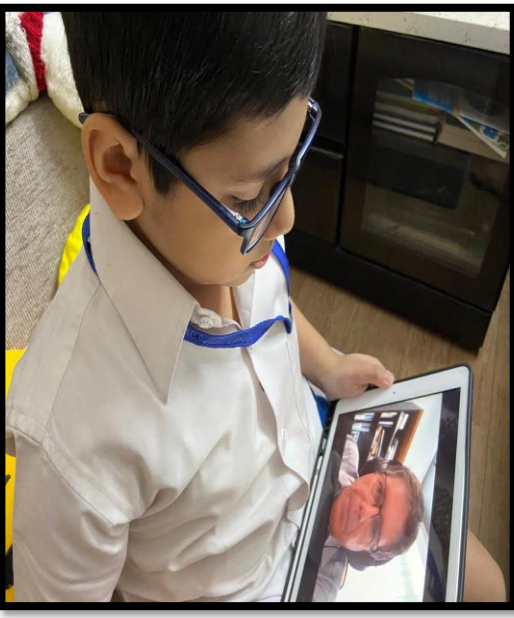
MARS EXPLORATION

To highlight the importance of reading and to mark the International Literacy day, Reading Week was observed from 8 to 14 September'20.

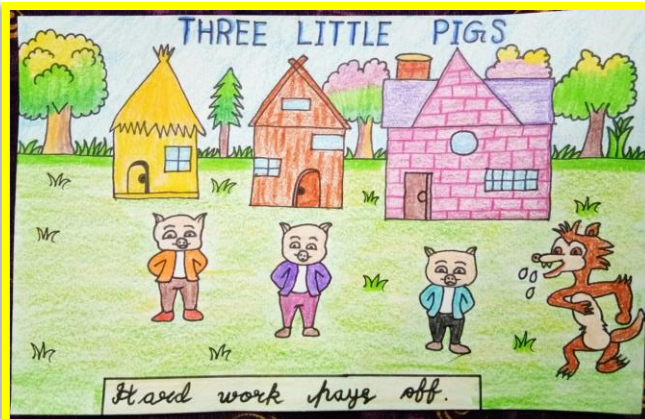
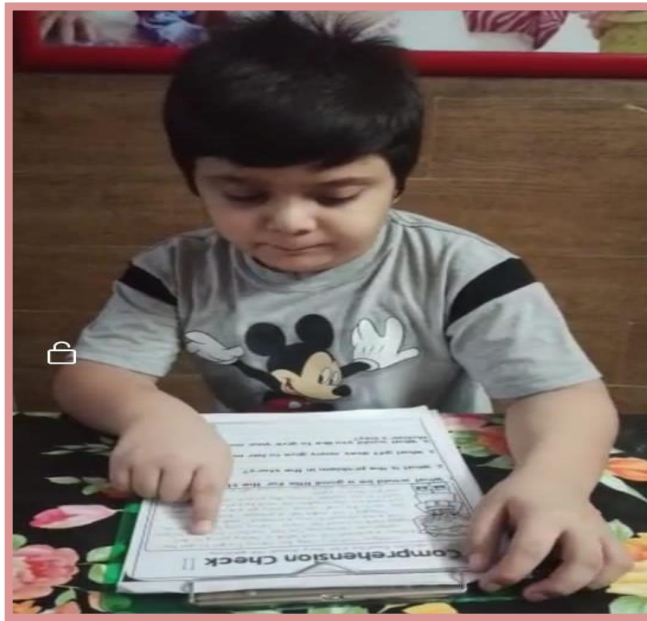


Special Virtual Assembly

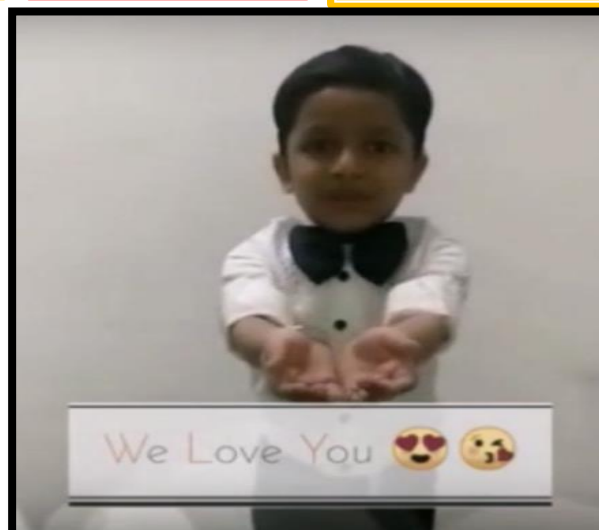

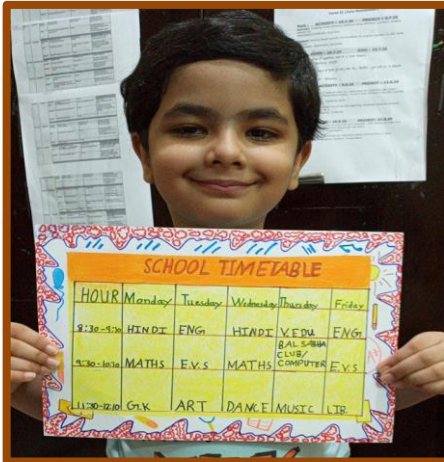
Special virtual morning assemblies were also organised through which the students of Class I-III saluted their mentors and expressed their gratitude and love towards them.

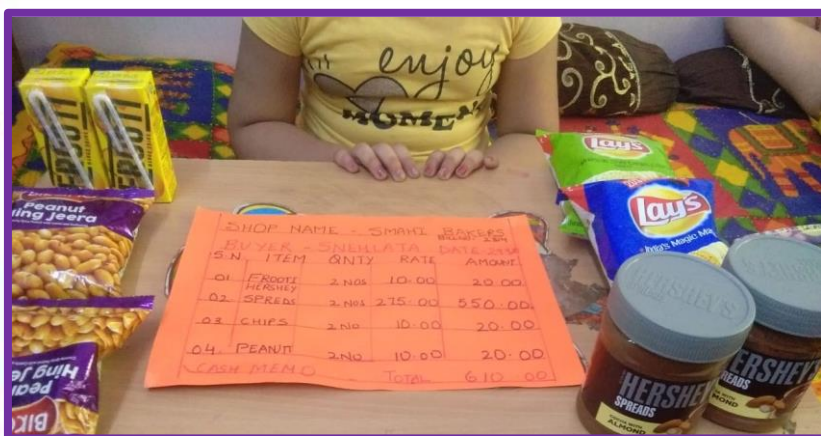
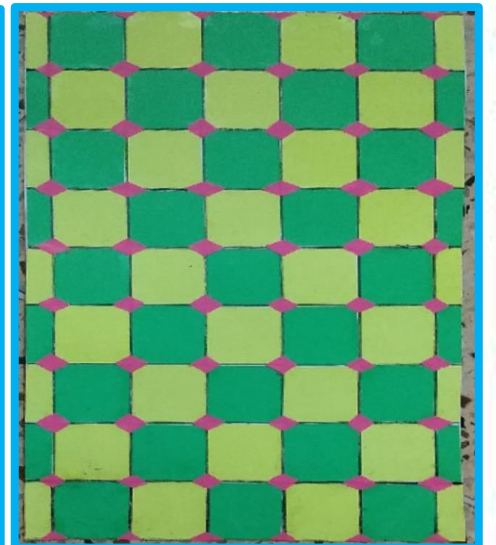


July - Making an Organiser

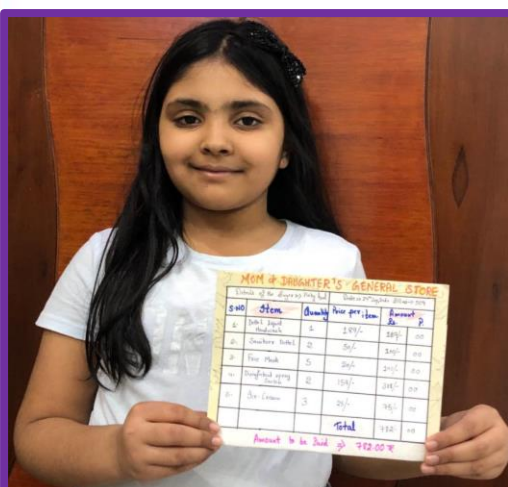
August - Tessellation Patterns

September - Creating a Cash Memo

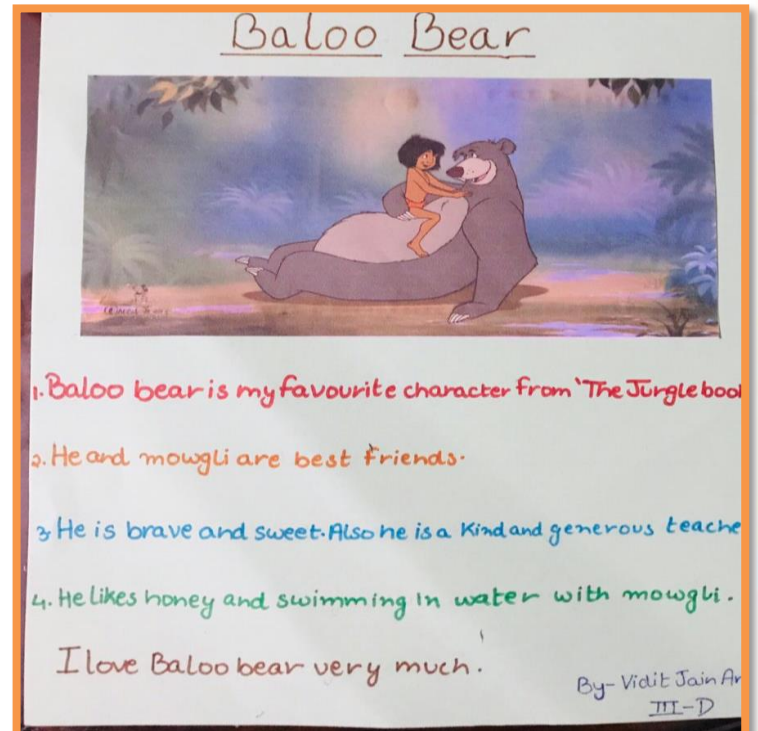
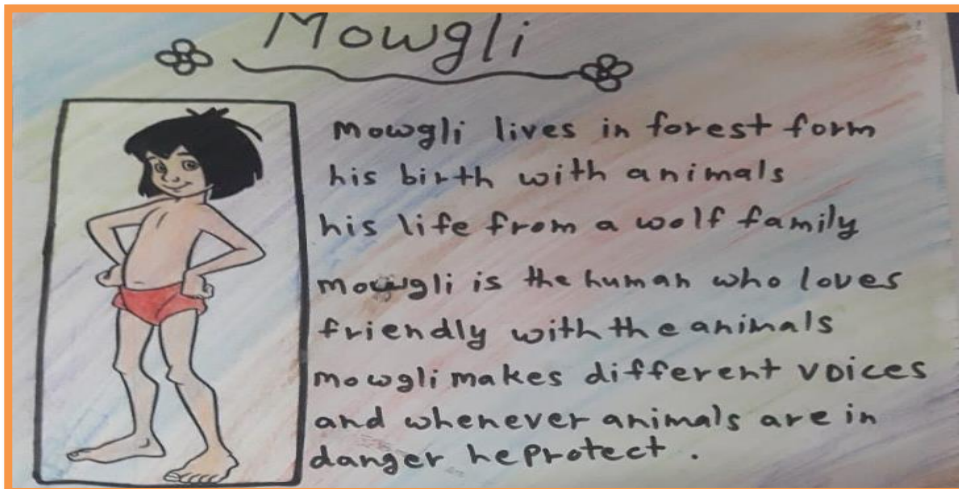

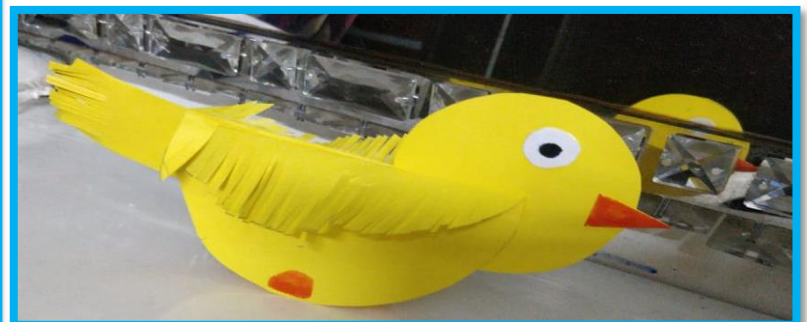


July - The Jungle Book

To celebrate the birthday of Rudyard Kipling, his famous book, 'The Jungle Book' was read. The students wrote about their favourite character.

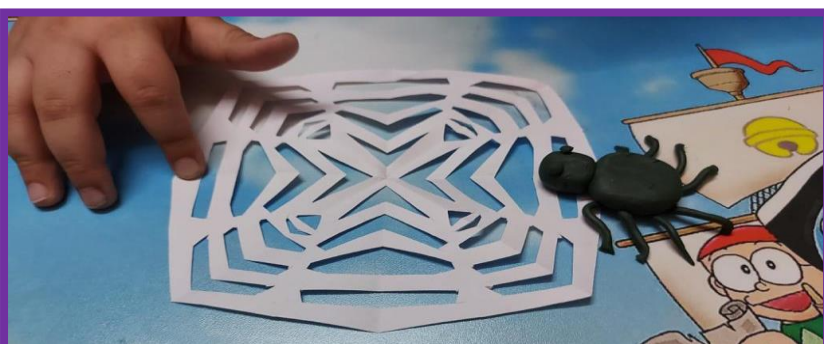
August - The Language of Birds

The curious learners were delighted by the scientific discovery of the phenomena of refraction by a simple experiment of arrow changing the direction when kept in front of a glass full of water.

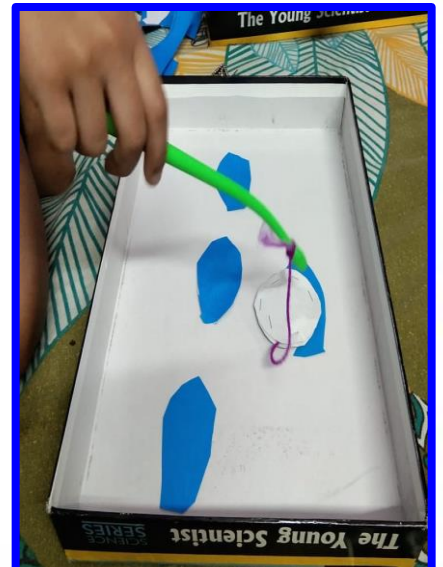
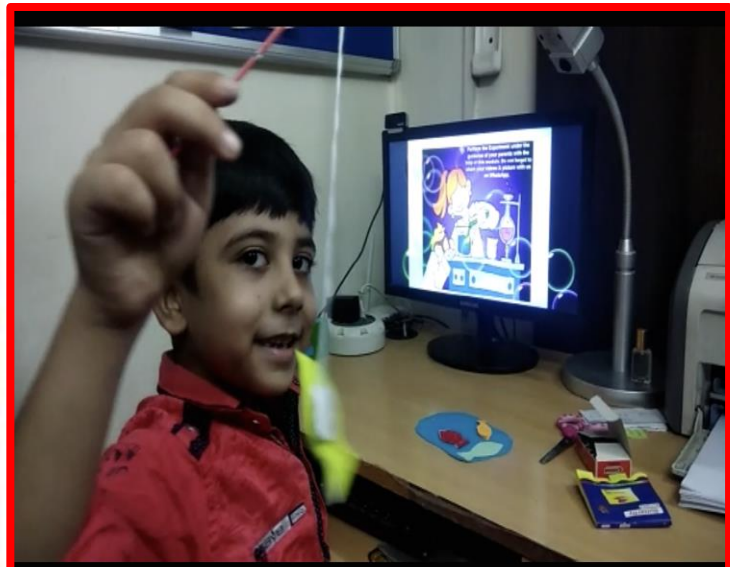


August - Fun with Invisible Ink

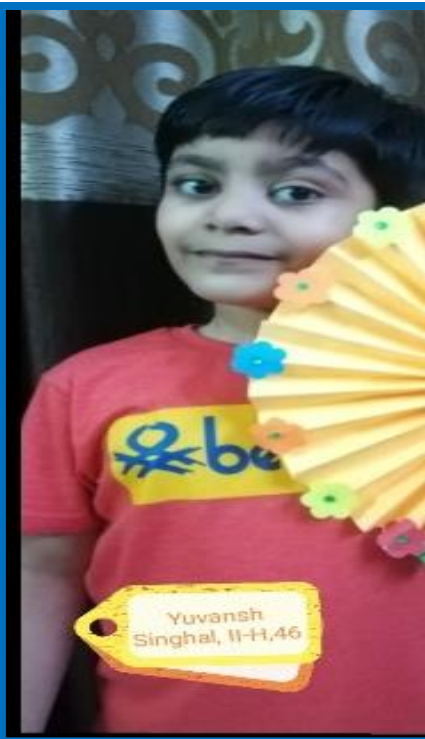
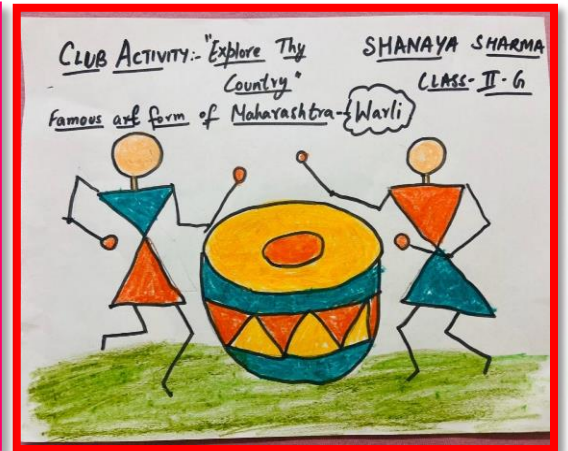
CLUB: Explore thy Country

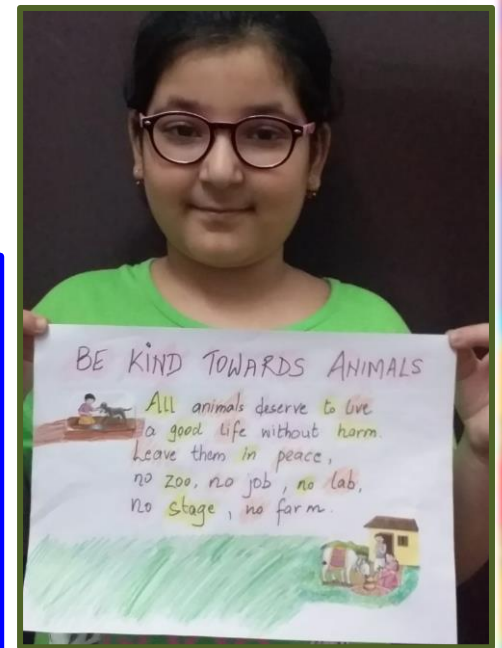

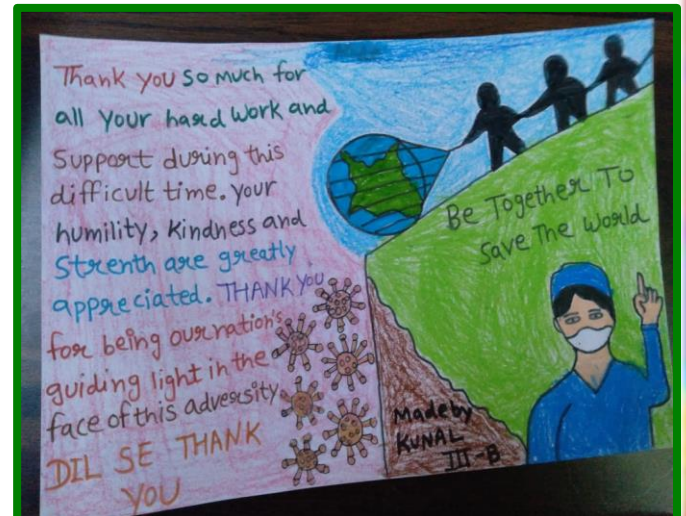
July - Be Kind Towards Animals

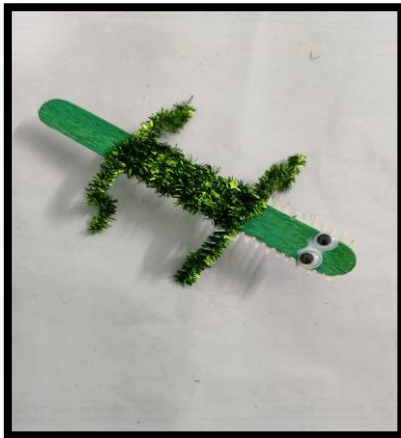


CLUB: Little Crafty Hands



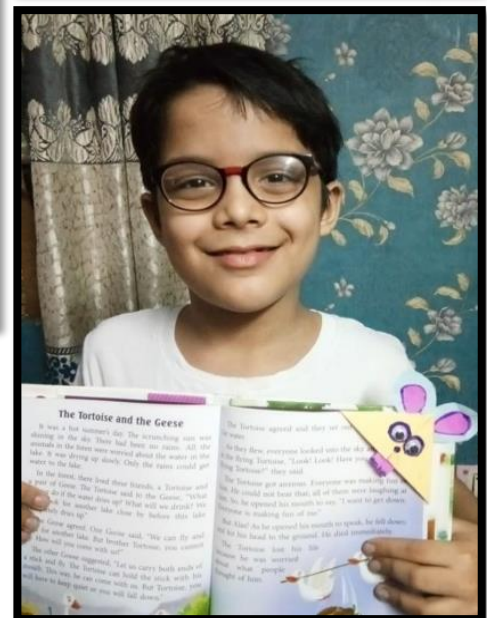
July - Craft Sticks

The activity gave the children an opportunity to explore the paper folding technique - Origami. They skillfully made beautiful Bunny Bookmarks and showcased their creativity.



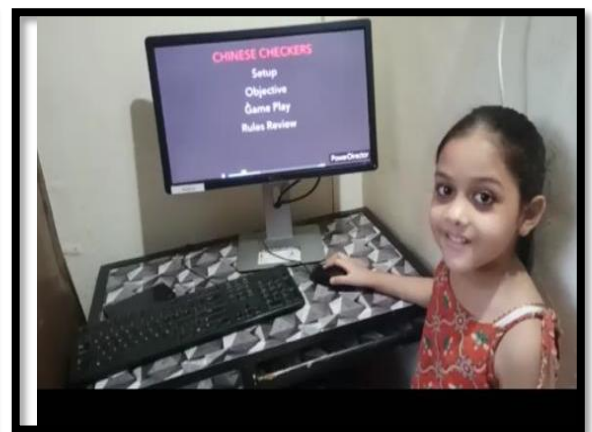


CLUB: Sporty Champions



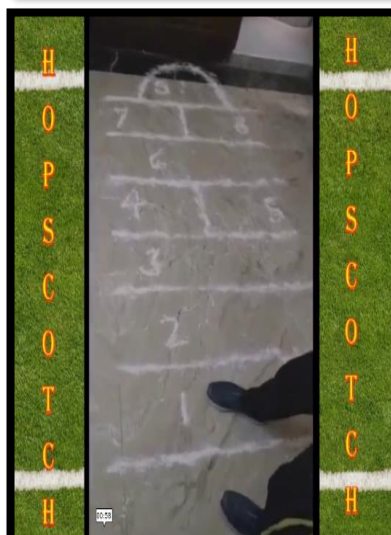
July - Chinese Checkers
