The interaction included a musical presentation by the students of our school and the girls from the Gurukul. The children of our school donated stationery items, handcrafted material and greeting cards to the girls of the Gurukul as a token of their love. The visit was a memorable experience for all.



Exploring Braille

An interactive session – ‘Exploring Braille’ was organised for the students in collaboration with The Blind Relief Organisation, Lodhi Road, New Delhi on 27.11.19. The session was conducted by Mr. Sudhanshu, a Braille instructor at The Blind School, Lodhi Road, New Delhi. The meaning and importance of Braille, a tactile reading and writing system used by the blind and visually impaired people was discussed and explained in the session. The students were shown the Hindi alphabet Braille slate, auditory cricket ball & football used by the blind children. In the follow up activity organised on 28.11.19 the students were shown videos on how the blind people use Braille for reading and writing. They were also given a hands-on experience and made to feel a book printed in Braille.



A visit to Gaushala

A visit to Gaushala, Rajinder Nagar was organised for the students on 30.01.20 with an aim to sensitise them and instill a feeling of love and care for animals. During the visit to the Gaushala the students saw the process of milking & also fed raw and green vegetables to the cows.



A Visit to Balika Ashram
