

The introductory activity of the Vernacular Club - 'भाषा-अन्वेषण' was conducted on 30.4.19. The aim of the activity was to develop and create interest of the students in different regional languages of India and thus preserve India's multiculturalism through multilingualism. The students were shown videos which apprised them of some basic phrases used in day-to-day communication in Assamese, Bangla, Tamil, Kannada, Marathi, Gujarati and Punjabi. It was an interactive session wherein students were made to practise the phrases they heard and read, along with the videos screened.

This was accompanied by the popular video 'मिले सुर मेरा तुम्हारा'... The video highlights different Indian linguistic communities and promotes unity amongst Indians. The activity was a joyful and enriching experience for the students.
