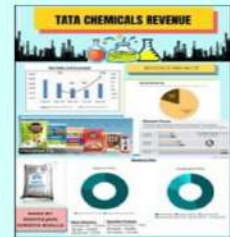

# CLUBS

## Commerce Club

Students created infographics on Multinational Indian Companies depicting a collection of imagery, charts, and minimal text giving an easy-to-understand overview of diverse topics.
