## CBSE and DoE Initiatives


#### SHRAMDAAN HOUR








#### The Silk Road: A 1400 year journey of Exchange through Time and Space





Visiting the Registan in Samarkand, one of the most iconic squares in the world.




Sampling the delicious food of Uzbekistan, from plov (rice pilaf) to samsa (meat pies). We visited Shaharesabz, the village of great Taimur.

### **MY JOURNEY TO SAR-PASS**

Trekking is the activity of walking long distances on foot for pleasure. People go to various places for trekking, mostly in mountains and jungles. I started trekking two years back. I went to Kheerganga trek and other small trails in the Himalayas. But this time it was a whole new and different experience for me. I enrolled myself in the Sarpass Expedition cum training program. It was thrilling and exciting as well as challenging both mentally and physically. On 25th May, our journey started from Delhi to the Kasol basecamp. Our basecamp was at the height of 5,184ft. After the orientation and cultural program, all the other participants introduced themselves to the group and our group titled SP-30.

Day 2 was our training day, we woke up at 5 am and went for a 3km run followed by some exercise and other physical activities. Then after breakfast, we were called for another training round including a small trek to the uphill for acclimatization.

On Day 3 we were all set to start our expedition from our Kasol base camp to the Grahan Village. We started around 8:30 am, it was a 9km trek from the forest side. After 5km, the trail was getting inclined and we were gaining altitude pretty quickly. At 3 pm, we reached our 1st campsite at Grahan village which was at an altitude of 7,700 ft.

The next morning, we headed toward our next campsite Min-Thach which is at 11,100 ft. The trek was quite moderate and it was mostly uphill through the forest. After reaching the campsite, we witnessed some of the beautiful scenic views. At the time of dusk, we had a great fun evening with other group members, we played games and shared stories and previous trekking experiences.



On day 5, we were all set to go to our topmost campsite. Initially, the trek was smooth and inclined, as we were going up we were slowly reaching the top of the mountain and from there we can see all those trails we covered in the last couple of days and our previous campsites. After lunch, the weather turned around and it was getting difficult to climb up because it started raining and hail storming. The climb was almost 110 degrees, it was tough and challenging but after reaching our topmost campsite i.e. Nagaru campsite which was at 12,700 ft. We faced some tough weather conditions that evening, it was a continuous snowstorm. It was very chilling and hard to spend the night there but we all were aware that the next day we would get our reward. We woke up at 3 am it was all dark and the weather was not that

favourable. We all knew that it was going to be a long day and it would throw some more challenges toward us. At 4:30 am we headed towards our first milestone which is Sar-Pass. Through the uphill trail covered with snow and continuous snow storm around us made it very difficult to climb up.

At 7:05 am we reached the top of Sar-Pass, 13,800ft. The sense of achievement and the satisfactory view from there mesmerized all of us. We all knew that it was the moment we all waited for but soon realized that it was the wholej ourney that made it more special. It was the reward we got after all the hard work, discipline, consistency, and the challenges we faced individually and all together. We then crossed the Sar-Pass and headed to reach the next milestone i.e. Biskeri Top 13,500 ft. We thought that now we need to descend and the Sun came up, the weather seems to be clear it would not that much difficult, but the toughest part was yet to come. After walking on a long stretch of snow, most of us were tired and our energy drained as we were walking for the last 7 hours and we were not halfway through to our last campsite. Just before reaching the Biskeri Top, we need to climb 90 degrees straight up and it was the most difficult part of our whole expedition. After reaching the top now we need to get down from the other side of the mountain. Sometimes to get down from a mountain we need to slide down from it over the snow and that's when the fun part begins. One by one we all started sliding down from it, there were 3-4 long slides and one of them was approx. 1km. After a whole long adventurous day, we reached our last campsite around 6 pm. We trekked almost 14 hours that day and mostly more than 12km on snow. The next day we need to reach our base camp. It was raining heavily that day while walking down through the forest.

That was all very tough and challenging but we learned something that day, when things get tough, the tougher gets going. That also fits into our lives, it would be difficult sometimes, and we'll face challenges, but we will also have fun moments that we'll cherish, but all we need is to keep moving forward to reach our destination, and also enjoy the journey because as it is said "Safar khoobsurat hai manzil se bhi."
