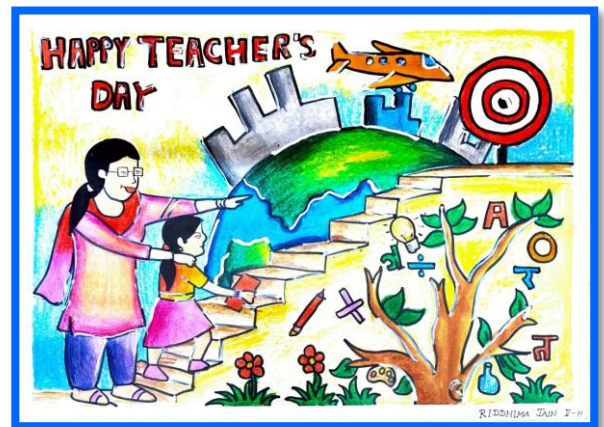

We are grateful beyond words for your exceptional mentorship. Thank you for inspiring us to believe in ourselves and to never give up on our dreams!

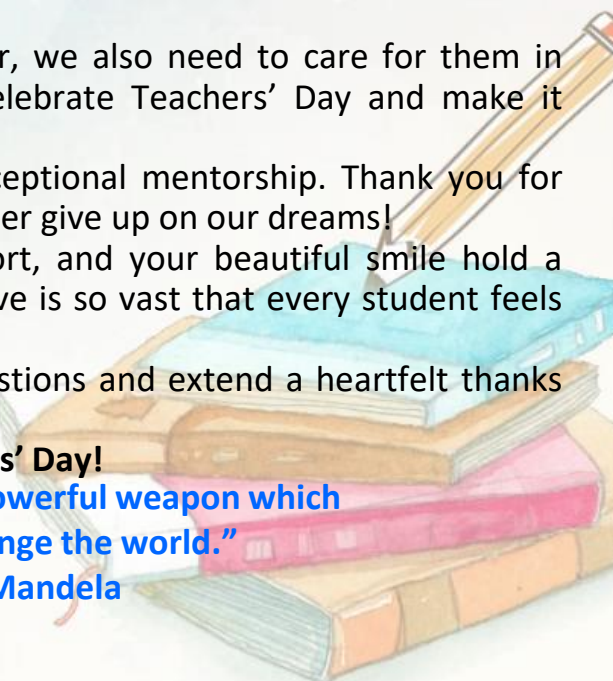

INDIA

Every year, India celebrates the birth anniversary of Dr Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan as National Teachers' Day as a tribute to his contributions and achievements.

We celebrate this day in honour of all those who continue to teach and inspire students and help them broaden the vistas of their knowledge with selfless dedication and consistent guidance.

Special assemblies and programmes are organised to felicitate teachers all over India on this special day.

The National Award to Teachers are given away by the President of India on 5th September (Teachers' Day) every year to give public recognition to meritorious teachers working in primary, middle and secondary schools. The award was instituted in 1958.

AUSTRALIA

On Australia's celebration of World Teachers' Day, the NEITA Foundation and the Australian Scholarships Group (ASG) announce the national teaching recipients of the ASG Community Merit Awards. If the last Friday of the month falls on 31 October, coinciding with Halloween, the celebration is postponed to 7 November

CANADA

Teacher Appreciation Day is marked in Canada on October 5 to celebrate all the hard work teachers across the country put in students' lives and in their communities. On this day, people can give gifts or hold special luncheons. The day is observed each year on the first Tuesday of May.

JAPAN

October 5th is Teachers' Day in Japan but it is not recognized at the school level. It is celebrated more on social media.

RUSSIA

On National Teachers' Day (October 5), Russia celebrates its teachers through various events and ceremonies. In particular, children enjoy playing games and participating in competitions on this day, and some students even prepare plays or dances.

BRAZIL

Every 15th of October, the time Brazil celebrates the national Brazil Teachers' Day, is also the time Emperor Pedro I signed into law creating the schools for the lower classes.

The Teachers' Day is always remembered by teachers as the time when their efforts are recognized by the government, the parents, as well as the students.

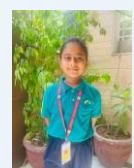
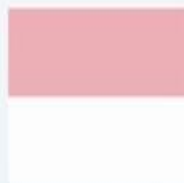
CHINA

Every year, French teachers are celebrated on the fourth Thursday of November, an initiative of the International Federation of French Teachers.

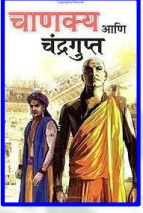

MY TEACHER, MY TORCHBEARER

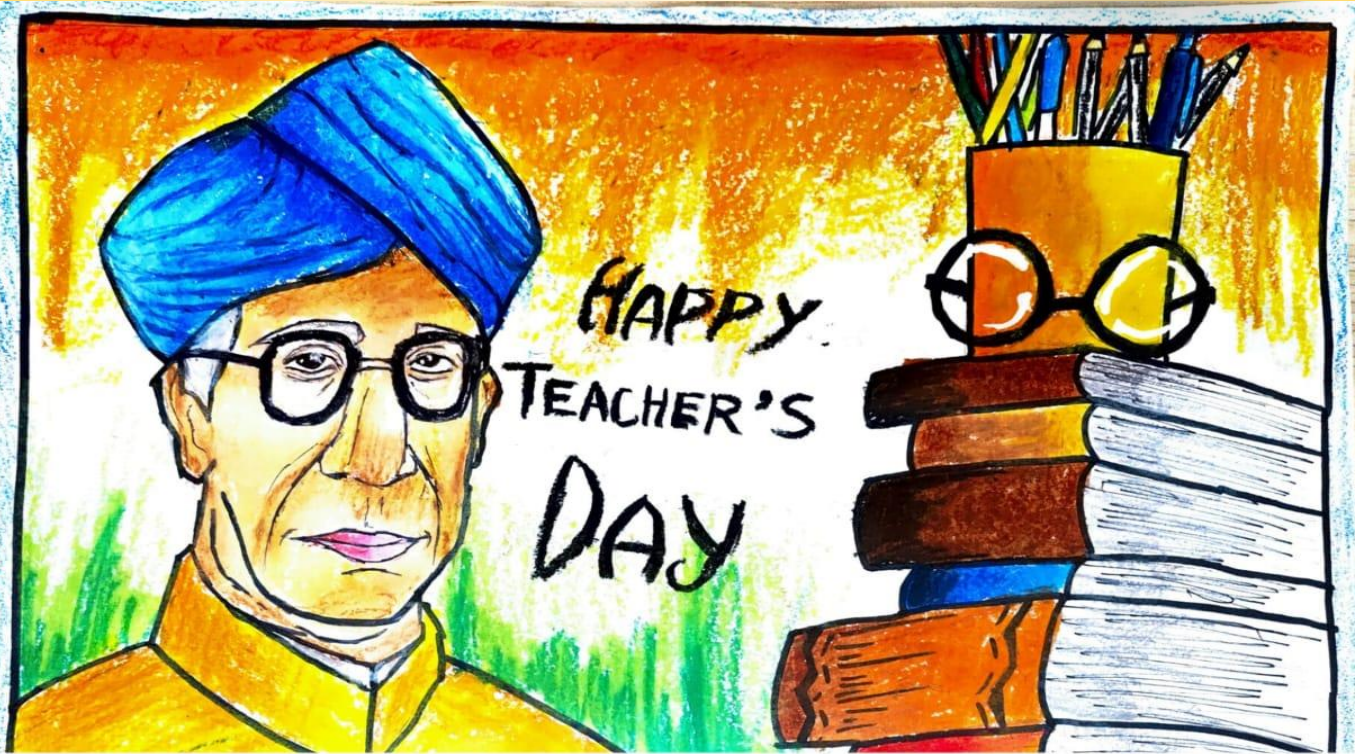

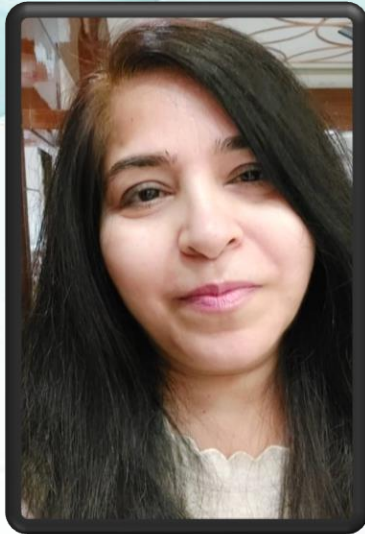
