



Assamese jewellery is named after the design it has taken from like Jon Biri (Half Moon/crescent shaped pendant), Lokaparo (two pigeons placed back-to-back), Jethi Poti (lizard's tail and has a row of small medallions in the shape of a V and a central pendant), Dhol Biri(shaped in the form of a drum).



• Design your own Assamese jewellery using paper, cardboard, clay and beads.

Fabric Designing

The Assamese adorn very simple dresses, and mostly hand loomed. The women wear motif-rich Mekhela Chador or Riha- Mekhela. The men wear 'suria' or 'dhoti', and over it, they drape a chadar known as 'Seleng'. Gamucha is an indispensable part of almost all socio-religious ceremonies in Assam.



 Design a pillow cover/ T- shirt / Kurta / Cloth bag using a block printing depicting a traditional Assamese design.


